Davis & Associates, Inc. share of this project consisted of the Demolition and General Trades Packages for an addition of the mechanical Penthouse and reroofing of 5 East wing. We also completed a massive and complete gut-out of the floor in the 5 East wing. This involved removing plaster ceilings; plastering and glazing tile walls; and the demolition of all of the mechanical and electrical piping equipment.

We completed similar demolition on 4 East and 2 North wings. The demolition on 2 North wing presented its own challenges in that some of the mechanical and electrical remained, but the walls did not. And, of course, we dealt with the usual distractions of working in a functioning hospital and following all of the infection control guidelines. Following finishes, we also installed doors and hardware, furnishings and accessories, etc. The rooms on 5th Floor will become patient rooms while the rooms on 2nd Floor will be surgical prep and critical care rooms.



I would like to thank everyone for the great effort in safety last year; we went incident free and is MICCS Certified again this year, let's keep up the good work.



With Spring just around the corner those dreaded orange barrels will be popping up all over the roadways. Here are some tips for driving safely in work zones:

- **Expect the unexpected:** normal speed limits may be reduced, traffic lanes may be changed, and people may be working on or near the roads.
- **Slow down:** speeding is one of the major causes of work zone crashes.
- **Don't tailgate:** keep a safe distance between you and the car ahead of you. The most common crash in a highway work zone is the rear end collision.
- **Keep your distance:** keep a safe distance between your vehicle and the construction workers and their equipment.
- **Pay attention to the signs:** the warning signs are there to help you and other drivers move safe through the work zone. Observe the posted signs until you see the one that says you've left the work zone.
- **Obey road crew flaggers:** the flagger knows what is best for moving traffic safely in work zones. A flagger has the same authority as a regulatory sign, so you can be cited for disobeying his or her directions.
- **Stay alert and minimize distractions:** dedicate your full attention to the roadway; avoid changing radio stations or using cell phones while driving.
- **Keep up with the traffic flow:** motorists can help maintain traffic flow and posted speeds by merging as soon as possible. Don't drive right up to the lane closure and then try to barge in.
- **Expect delays:** schedule enough time to travel safely; check the radio, TV and web-sites for traffic updates.
